Social Events/Meetings

School goals are supported by well-conceived and well-managed social events, and parents expect their children to learn and to feel at ease in appropriate social situations. Consequently, parties, dances and comparable social events have an important place in a well-rounded school program. The staff is encouraged to utilize such events intelligently.

**Promotion/Graduation Parties**

Sixth - Eighth Grade Promotion Parties:

Sixth and eighth grade students may conduct year-end social events in a manner acceptable to their respective building principals. Activities should be proper for the age level of the participants and designed to encourage a broad level of interest and participation.

Senior Class Graduation Parties:

Senior class graduation parties are not a responsibility of the District. Official school jurisdiction over graduating seniors ends with the conclusion of the graduation ceremonies and the return of graduation regalia charged to the student.

Notwithstanding the above, during the period of organization and preparation for such an event, school officials are expected to cooperate with the parent group sponsoring the recognized school graduation party (recognized school graduation party is one normally sponsored by the school parent-faculty organization or PTA and which the building principal feels is an activity that safeguards the welfare of the student participating). Faculty members may attend graduation parties along with parents and assist as chaperons, but not in the capacity of school officials.
