Budget - FAQs January 22, 2009



1. How much is the District's budget shortfall?

- a. For 2008-09 the estimated impact to OUSD is \$8.6 million.
- b. For 2009-10 the estimated impact is \$10.2 million.

2. Can the District continue to fund its payroll?

a. The District anticipates being able to meet payroll and pay vendors without needing to borrow from an outside source until September 2009.

3. Will there be a roll-back in salaries for all personnel? If so, how much and when will it take effect?

- a. That has not been determined at this time.
- b. Salaries are negotiable. Nothing will take effect prior to July 1, 2009.

4. Will there be classified layoffs? If so, when?

- a. That has not been determined at this time.
- b. Classified layoffs require 45 days notice, after Board approval.

5. Will there be certificated layoffs? If so, when?

- a. That has not been determined at this time.
- b. Certificated layoffs require notices by March 15, 2009, after Board approval.

6. Will there be leadership layoffs? If so, when?

a. That has not been determined at this time.

7. Will another retirement incentive package be offered to District employees?

a. No.

8. What effect do the retiree lifetime benefits have on the District's budget?

- a. The estimated amount for 2009-10 = \$7.436.862
- b. The District's total budget is \$251,196,525

9. Is it true that the District is closing small schools?

a. A study is underway to determine the cost savings for consolidating smaller schools. No decisions have been made.

10. What will be the timeline should schools be closed?

a. No sooner than the start of the 2009-10 school year.

11. What becomes of the staff and teachers at the closed schools?

a. There are variables to be considered. Seniority is determined by union contract.

12. What will become of the school sites should they be closed?

a. Unknown at this time.

13. Is the District going to one student calendar? If so, when will this take effect?

- a. A study is underway to determine the cost savings. No decisions have been made.
- b. No sooner than the start of the 2009-10 school year.

14. Will class size reduction be eliminated at all grade levels?

a. No decision has been made.

15. Will the school year be cut by five days?

a. The Governor has proposed reducing the school year by five days. At this point, this is only a proposal and is subject to negotiation.

16. Will summer school be eliminated?

a. The cost impact is being studied.

17. Will the District eliminate GATE magnet schools?

a. The cost impact is being studied.

18. Can the money generated from the sale of surplus properties be used to offset general fund expenditures?

a. No, funds from the sale of surplus properties must be used for facilities purposes and cannot be used for general fund expenses.

19. Will modernization and construction projects come to a halt during the state budget crisis?

a. Projects under construction will not be stopped; however, future modernizations are projected to slow down due to a lack of State matching fund availability.

20. In addition to eliminating District cell phones for personnel, what other cost saving measures have been implemented?

- a. Eliminated out-of-state travel
- b. Restricted conference attendance
- c. Limited categorical expenditures
- d. Reduced use of substitutes
- e. Implemented hiring and spending freeze

21. How will the Superintendent weigh recommended suggestions in making decisions?

a. All suggestions will be carefully considered by the Superintendent and the Superintendent's Cabinet in the budget reduction plan preparation.

22. How can parents help?

- a. Make sure that students attend school every day.
- b. Check school and District websites for updates.
