I. CALL TO ORDER

Ms. Cavecche presented to the committee the Anaheim Union Oversight Committee bylaws, which she modified to include appropriate language for the Orange Unified COC. The COC members further

discussed that limited, but structured bylaws may provide ways to define the oversight process should changes in the COC become necessary. It was further stated that COC exercise complete independency from the Board of Education, as the COC's main function is to ensure that bond funds are expended on authorized projects from the bond project list. The committee members requested additional time to examine the bylaws and pertinent Education Codes, so a volunteer subcommittee was called for that purpose. Subcommittee members are Carolyn Cavecche, Mrunal Shah, and Diana Fascenelli. Subcommittee members will review current documents, information, and report to the COC regarding the adoption of COC bylaws at the next COC meeting.
